His research at NIOSH focused on silica dust control in the construction industry.

CAPT Echt served on the COA Legislative Affairs committee for several years and most recently as committee chair. His advocacy at the state level has focused on Ohio and he has developed a state advocacy guide for PHS officers. He has also created a guide for state taxes for retired officers. He continues to assist COA with the federal legislative agenda.

CAPT Echt's awards include the USPHS Distinguished Service Medal, the EHO Professional Advisory Committee's Moran and Todd awards, and the COA Brutsche award.
